

The feeling of being much larger/smaller than you really are is a symptom of ALICE IN WONDERLAND SYNDROME (AIWS), which may be linked to epilepsy.

PICA is an abnormal craving for non-food items, such as dirt, soap or paint chips and can be associated with a mineral deficiency, autism and schizophrenia.

A study finds the **INABILITY TO SMELL** peppermint, fish, orange, rose and leather could be an accurate early warning sign of Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia.

BREATH THAT SMELLS FRUITY (or like nail polish) indicates the presence of life-threatening diabetic ketoacidosis (DKA), accounting for 50% of deaths among type 1 diabetics.


50% OF SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATHS occur outside of a hospital, suggesting that many people do not act on early warning signs, including stomach pain, shortness of breath, chest palpitations, nausea and dizziness.

A limb's involuntary movement can be a symptom of ALIEN HAND SYNDROME (AHS), which is associated with multiple sclerosis and other diseases.

Abnormally SMALL, CRAMPED HANDWRITING (MICROGRAPHIA), is caused by the same processes in the brain that lead to other movement symptoms of Parkinson's disease.

CLOUDY URINE is a sign of urinary tract infection (UTI). One study showed that antibiotic resistance has triggered an increase in hospitalizations for UTIs, from 12.9% to 18.4%.

FREQUENT BRUISING on the back, legs and hands can indicate Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML). Other symptoms can include bone pain, nosebleeds, shortness of breath and fever.
